Workers employed in occupations that typically require a post-secondary certification or degree **earn on average 20K+ more per year** than workers who do not.

\$52,830

Overall, non-certified allied health workers on average earn \$36,100 in occupations that do not require a postsecondary certificate or degree, while certified allied health workers with an associate degree on average earn \$52,830. This demonstrates a clear benefit in obtaining a training certificate or degree as it increases a worker's lifelong earnings and purchasing power.¹



As one moves up career pathways, automation risk decreases and earnings increase.²
